Summary of Committee Investigations 118th Congress, 1st Session May 2023

The Biden Border Crisis

The Committee's investigation of the root causes of the Biden border crisis and the Administration's lax immigration enforcement, and our examination of facts to inform potential legislative reforms, is ongoing.

Weaponization of the Federal Government

The Committee, through its Select Subcommittee on the Weaponization of the Federal Government, continues to examine the weaponization of the federal government to inform potential legislative reforms.

The ATF's regulatory overreach

The Committee, through its Subcommittee on Crime and its Subcommittee on the Administrative State, is conducing oversight of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives' effort to regulate firearms without express delegation from Congress to do so.

Politically motivated prosecutions

The Committee is conducting oversight of the New York County District Attorney's prosecution of a former President and current declared candidate for that office to inform potential legislative reforms that would, among other things, insulate current and/or former Presidents from politically motivated state and local prosecutions, or prohibit the use of federal forfeiture funds to be used by a state or local agency for the investigation or prosecution of a current or former President or a declared candidate for President.
