CN#24-285 – USTDA proposes to obligate approximately \$2,500,000 to fund technical assistance related to the development of the Subic-Clark-Manila-Batangas (SCMB) Railway, a proposed 220-kilometer rail line connecting the major ports of Subic Bay, Manila, and Batangas in the Philippines. The technical assistance would support the Philippines' Department of Transportation (DOTr) in conducting the project preparation work needed to prepare the SCMB Railway for financing. The technical assistance would consist of conducting the transport model surveys, assessing the port-rail integration options, conducting the environmental impact and climate assessments, and recommending the optimal legal and institutional framework for the SCMB Railway. USTDA estimates that this project has a U.S. export potential of \$392.52 million.

CN #2025-03 – USTDA proposes to obligate approximately \$422,000 for a Small Modular Reactor (SMR) and Microreactor Nuclear technologies Reverse Trade Mission (RTM). The RTM would familiarize decision-makers from the Philippines with state-of-the-art U.S. nuclear energy technologies, including SMRs, Microreactors, and other relevant nuclear energy technologies across the civil nuclear energy value chain. The RTM would highlight U.S. best practices in SMR standards, regulations, and safety practices, and would also address the nuclear energy project lifecycle, strategies for nuclear deployments, workforce development, and the risks associated with nascent nuclear technologies such as licensing, permitting, and financing. USTDA estimates that this RTM has an export potential of \$754 million.
