То	amend the Help America Vote Act of 2002 to prohibit payments under such Act to States which permit ballot harvesting, and for other purposes.
1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Election Fraud Pre-
5	vention Act".
6	SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
7	Congress finds that—

1	(1) the right to vote is a fundamental right of
2	citizens of the United States;
3	(2) it is the responsibility of the State and Fed-
4	eral Governments to ensure that elections are con-
5	ducted with integrity;
6	(3) the Committee on House Administration of
7	the House of Representatives, which is charged with
8	investigating election irregularities, received reports
9	through its official Election Observer Program for
10	the 2018 general election that individuals other than
11	voters themselves were depositing large amounts of
12	absentee ballots at polling places throughout Cali-
13	fornia, a practice colloquially known as "ballot har-
14	vesting";
15	(4) the practice of ballot harvesting in Cali-
16	fornia creates significant vulnerabilities in the chain-
17	of-custody of ballots because individuals collecting
18	ballots are not required to be registered voters and
19	are not required to identify themselves at a voter's
20	home, and the State does not track how many bal-
21	lots are harvested in an election;
22	(5) in North Carolina, a congressional election
23	was invalidated due to fraud associated with ballot
24	harvesting committed by a political operative, and it
25	is unlikely such activity would have been detected

1	were it not for the prohibition against ballot har-
2	vesting in the State; and
3	(6) ballot harvesting invites electioneering activ-
4	ity at home and creates the possibility of undue in-
5	fluence over voters by political operatives.
